

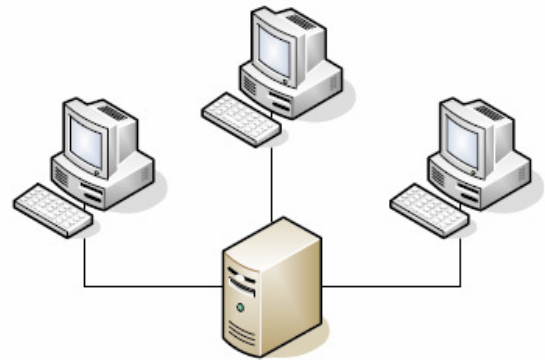
Vault Fundamentals

Vault Fundamentals is a comprehensive introductory course to Vault, delivered by an Autodesk Certified Trainer. Taken over two days, the course is designed to teach students the fundamental steps in working with and setting up Vault to work with Inventor, other Autodesk products, and Microsoft products, and its practical application to industry.

The course is structured for students to achieve a series of daily milestones, resulting in the competent usage of Vault at the completion of the course.

The course is both hands-on exercises and instructor lead discussion and demonstrations.

Starting with the theory behind Vault and File Management, students learn to move around the environment and interface with other products. They learn how to check files in and out of the Vault and how to manage versions of files. They also learn about how and why you can label Vaults.



They work in a combination of stand alone and in a multi user environment with the other students.

They also learn how to manage different projects, setup libraries, and share files with other users.

Once they have a good feel of using vault we move into Managing Vaults. This looks at how to install and setup, and all requirements involved. It takes the users through items such as Moving Vaults, detaching them, deleting Vaults, and how to create and attach Vaults.

We also look at the important area of Backing up and Restoring Vaults, as well as the full management of users that are accessing the Vaults.
